

# SIOP Protocol: The TOOL

The Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) (Adapted from Echevarria, Vogt, & Short, 2000, 2004.)	
SIOP Feature	Defining Characteristics at the Highest Level of Enacting
Preparation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Clearly defined content objectives for students</li> <li>Clearly defined language objectives for students</li> <li>Content concepts appropriate for age and educational background level of students</li> <li>Supplementary materials used to a high degree, making the lesson clear and meaningful (e.g., computer programs, graphs, models, visuals)</li> <li>Adaptation of content (e.g., text, assignment) to all levels of student proficiency</li> <li>Meaningful Activities that integrate lesson concepts (e.g., surveys, letter writing, simulations, constructing models) with language practice opportunities for reading, writing, listening, and/or speaking</li> </ul>
Building Background	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Concepts explicitly linked to students' background experiences</li> <li>Links explicitly made between past learning and new concepts</li> <li>Key vocabulary emphasized (e.g., introduced, written, repeated, and highlighted for students to see)</li> </ul>
Comprehensible Input	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Speech appropriate for students' proficiency level (e.g., slower rate, enunciation, and simple sentence structure for beginners)</li> <li>Explanation of academic tasks clear</li> <li>A variety of techniques used to make content concepts clear (e.g., modeling, visuals, hands-on activities, demonstrations, gestures, body language)</li> </ul>
Strategies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ample opportunities provided for students to use strategies</li> <li>Consistent use of scaffolding techniques throughout lesson, assisting and supporting student understanding (e.g., think-alouds)</li> <li>Teacher uses a variety of question types, including those that promote higher-order thinking skills (e.g., literal, analytical, and interpretive questions)</li> </ul>
Interaction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Frequent opportunities for interaction and discussion between teacher/student and among students, which encourage elaborated responses about lesson concepts</li> <li>Grouping configurations support language and content objectives of the lesson</li> <li>Sufficient wait time consistently provided for student responses</li> <li>Ample opportunity for students to clarify key concepts in L1 as needed with aide, peer, or L1 text</li> </ul>
Practice/ Application	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Provides hands-on materials and/or manipulatives for students to practice using new content knowledge</li> <li>Provides activities for students to apply content and language knowledge in the classroom</li> <li>Uses activities that integrate all language skills (i.e., reading, writing, listening, and speaking)</li> </ul>
Effectiveness of Lesson Delivery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Content objectives clearly supported by lesson delivery</li> <li>Language objectives clearly supported by lesson delivery</li> <li>Students engaged approximately 90% to 100% of the period</li> <li>Pacing of the lesson appropriate to the students' ability level</li> </ul>
Lesson Review/ Evaluation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Comprehensive review of key vocabulary</li> <li>Comprehensive review of key content concepts</li> <li>Feedback is regularly provided to students on their output (e.g., language, content, work)</li> <li>Ongoing assessment of comprehension and learning of all objectives (e.g., spot checking, group response) is conducted throughout the lesson</li> </ul>
